APPROVE EXECUTION OF DESIGNATION OF APPLICANT'S AGENT RESOLUTION FOR NON-STATE AGENCIES ALLOWING FOR GRANT APPLICATION ON BEHALF OF LA-RICS AUTHORITY

<u>SUBJECT</u>

Delegation is requested for the Executive Director to serve as LA-RICS' Authorized Agent in order to submit an application for federal financial assistance for any existing or future grant program, where applicable, as stated in the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies (Enclosure).

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

It is recommended that your Board:

- Delegate authority to the Executive Director and/or his designee to serve as the Authorized Agent and execute on behalf of LA-RICS, an application for the purpose of obtaining federal assistance for any existing or future grant program, including those listed in the Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution Form (Enclosure); and
- Authorize the Executive Director and/or his designee to provide to the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services (Cal OES) for all matters pertaining to such state disaster assistance the assurances and agreements required; and

- 3. Delegate Authority to the Chair of the LA-RICS Board of Directors to execute the Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution (Enclosure); and
- 4. Delegate Authority to the Board Secretary to execute the Certification of the Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution (Enclosure).

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

Cal OES requires the Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies execution in order to apply for federal financial assistance in connection with the federally declared disaster (DR) California Wildfires and Straight-line Winds, FEMA-4856-DR-CA. Additionally, by selecting the "universal resolution" option on page 2 of the enclosed Form, this authorization can be utilized for existing and future grant programs for three (3) years following the date of Board approval.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

There is no fiscal impact at this time. The Request for Public Assistance (RPA) for costs incurred while responding to or as a result of the California Wildfires and Straight-line Winds will be submitted by the deadline with subsequent report(s) to your Board once grant funds are awarded.

The Authority's counsel has reviewed the recommended actions.

AGREEMENTS/CONTRACTING PROCESS

Cal OES Form 130 Instructions

A Designation of Applicant's Agent Resolution for Non-State Agencies is required of all Applicants to be eligible to receive funding. A new resolution must be submitted if a previously submitted resolution is older than three (3) years from the last date of approval, is invalid, or has not been submitted.

When completing the Cal OES Form 130, Applicants should fill in the blanks on pages 1 and 2. The blanks are to be filled in as follows:

Resolution Section:

Governing Body: This is the group responsible for appointing and approving the Authorized Agents.

Examples include: Board of Directors, City Council, Board of Supervisors, Board of Education, etc.

Name of Applicant: The public entity established under the laws of the State of California.

Examples include: School District, Office of Education, City, County or Non-profit agency that has applied for the grant, such as: City of San Diego, Sacramento County, Burbank Unified School District, Napa County Office of Education, University Southern California.

Authorized Agent: These are the individuals that are authorized by the Governing Body to engage with the Federal Emergency Management Agency and the California Governor's Office of Emergency Services regarding grants for which they have applied. There are two ways of completing this section:

- 1. Titles Only: The titles of the Authorized Agents should be entered here, not their names. This allows the document to remain valid if an Authorized Agent leaves the position and is replaced by another individual. If "Titles Only" is the chosen method, this document must be accompanied by either a cover letter naming the Authorized Agents by name and title, or the Cal OES AA Names document. The supporting document can be completed by any authorized person within the Agency (e.g., administrative assistant, the Authorized Agent, secretary to the Director). It does not require the Governing Body's signature.
- 2. Names and Titles: If the Governing Body so chooses, the names **and** titles of the Authorized Agents would be listed. A new Cal OES Form 130 will be required if any of the Authorized Agents are replaced, leave the position listed on the document, or their title changes.

Checking Universal or Disaster-Specific Box: A Universal resolution is effective for all past disasters and for those declared up to three (3) years following the date of approval. Upon expiration it is no longer effective for new disasters, but it remains in effect for disasters declared prior to expiration. It remains effective until the disaster goes through closeout unless it is superseded by a newer resolution.

Governing Body Representative: These are the names and titles of the approving Board Members.

Examples include: Chairman of the Board, Director, Superintendent, etc. The names and titles **cannot** be one of the designated Authorized Agents. A minimum of three (3) approving board members must be listed. If less than three are present, meeting minutes must be attached in order to verify a quorum was met.

Certification Section:

Name and Title: This is the individual in attendance who recorded the creation and approval of this resolution.

Examples include: City Clerk, Secretary to the Board of Directors, County Clerk, etc. This person **cannot** be one of the designated Authorized Agents or Approving Board Member. If a person holds two positions (such as City Manager and Secretary to the Board) and the City Manager is to be listed as an Authorized Agent, then that person could sign the document as Secretary to the Board (not City Manager) to eliminate "Self-Certification."
