Technical Committee Chair Ted Pao called the meeting to order at 1:32 p.m.

II. ANNOUNCE QUORUM – Roll Call

Technical Committee Chair Pao asked for a roll call and acknowledged a quorum was present for Joint Operations and Technical Committee (Joint Committees).

III. APPROVAL OF MINUTES (A)

A. August 5, 2020 – Regular Meeting Minutes

Operations Technical Chair Pao asked for a motion to approve the minutes.

Joint Committee Member John Geiger motioned first, seconded by Operations Committee Chair Sven Crongeyer.

VI. REPORTS (B-E)

B. Status Report Update for LTE – Rick Burke

Televate Consultant Rick Burke provided an update on the Long Term Evolution (LTE) Public Safety Broadband Network (PSBN) Round 1 project and stated as of September 10, 2020, AT&T FirstNet is transitioning seventy-three (73) LTE sites into the network, with sixty-two (62) sites currently integrated into the AT&T network and eleven (11) sites remaining to be integrated.

The remaining sites are forecasted to be integrated by the first quarter of 2021, with sites being integrated each quarter up until completed.

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There was no further discussion.

C. Status Report Update for PSBN Round 2 Deployment – Project Director Chris Odenthal

Project Director Chris Odenthal provided an update on the deployment of LTE Round 2 and stated that Magic Mountain Link (MML) is on its way to be completed at the end of the month. In conjunction with the Land Mobile Radio (LMR) location at that site, all the work has been ongoing with the towers and equipment already on site. This site was not impacted by the fire.

In regards to the Montebello Police Department site, everything is progressing. We should get moving doing foundation tower in mid-October and finishing at the end of October 2020. Port of Los Angeles (POLA1 and POLA2) cell block design and towers are up and equipment in place. Only issue is a power delivery plan for POLA1 from the Los Angeles Department of Water and Power (LADWP). POLA2 site is connecting to a power source that is near the site at Fenix terminal.

The Port of Long Beach (POLB) site cleared for zoning and permitting and we are waiting for the release of that site from the City of Long Beach. AT&T requested us to hold off on construction until a final agreement is reached as they are still in negotiation with the Port and we don't want to construct at the site and not have AT&T and POLB agreed on the lease agreement.

LA-RICS is working with the POLB to assist with the lease negotiations; their issue is what is the appropriate rent to be charging. Both POLA and AT&T have agreed to rent cost and we have shared this information with POLB for the same purpose of them coming into an agreement.

Pomona 2 (POM2) waiting on final stamp approval on electrical from the Judicial Council of California (JCC). A different power source from Pomona was required and we are waiting on that approval.

The reason for the red sites on the chart provided in the agenda packet, is these were delayed on the close out side but we are not expecting any issues with AT&T from a funding perspective. Just a reminder all work associated with these are no longer under the BTOP Grant but are with AT&T.

There was no further discussion.

D. Status Report Update for LMR – Program Manager Justin Delfino

Program Manager Justin Delfino provided an update on the LMR system and provided detailed information on which sites are in construction, along with additional details supporting the construction-related activities occurring at these sites to date.





Program Manager Delfino stated that LMR has been moving along in spite of the recent fires for the last two weeks. There were specific sites that were less impacted than other sites. The sites that were most impacted were USFS sites and had access issues as certain highways were shut down thus limiting our ability to access the sites. One site to highlight is Frost Peak (FRP), which is immediately proximal to a ski resort/ operation that we are trying to finish construction prior to snow season.

There are twenty-nine (29) sites complete on LMR completed with sixteen (16) sites currently in construction and thirteen (13) sites remaining to complete. In terms of Coastal Development there is substantial progress there. We reported last time that ERB and SEATAC both were successfully passed and this upcoming September 23, 2020, is the Regional Planning Commission meeting for the Catalina sites.

All fleet mapping work has been completed. The Los Angeles Sheriff's Department (LASD) and Technical Lead Engineer Pao has been monitoring the progress there. In terms of the LMR schedule, there is a consensus and we plan on having a resolution on a final completion date at the end of this week, September 18, 2020.

Program Manager Delfino stated there are three (3) outstanding SAAs for the following sites: TWR, BJM, DPK. Phase 4 work such as site Optimization and microwave alignment is currently underway. Narrow-banding is underway for Channel 16, with Technical Lead Engineer Pao aiding in that coordination with Los Angeles Sheriff's Department (LASD).

In regards to the United States Forest Service (USFS) sites, construction on ESR, MTL2 and BUR1 are scheduled to start in September, however, due to the recent fire activity it may have caused disruption to the forecasted start dates. More information will be known in the second week of September 2020.

There was no further discussion.

E. Regional ISSI Interoperability Working Group – Steve Page/Ted Pao

Technical Committee Chair Pao provided an overview and status update and stated the Regional Interoperability/ISSI working group will be meeting again on September 24, 2020, to review the status of the Interconnection between ICI system and LA-RICS (ICI-RICS) connection and discuss the status of the other connections.

Discussion of connection-specific parameters need to begin involving both technical and operations staff so that when the testing is in process, configurations can be set up properly the first time. The agreement between LA-RICS and Long Beach is in process with drafts of the agreement being discussed.

Committee Member John Geiger asked if the Los Angeles County's County Wide Integrated Radio System (CWIRS) could be included in this working group, and Technical Committee Chair Pao concurred.

G. Distribution of the LARTCS/ACVRS Channel Plan – Ted Pao

Technical Committee Chair Pao provided an update on the distribution of the LARTCS/ACVRS Channel Plan and stated LA-RICS is building out its analog conventional voice radio system later and Los Angeles Regional Tactical Communication System (LARTCS), there is a set of analog channels that will be available for member agencies to access for its special operation or mutual aid operations. If any agency deems it is necessary to conduct a special operation on an analog conventional channel, rather than its trucking talk groups, it can request for the use of the pool of analog channels.

LASD and Los Angeles Fire Department (LACoFD) will jointly manage these channels. If a fire agency needs a channel, it can make a request directly to County Fire Dispatch. Similarly, for law agencies, they can request through Sheriff's Communication Center.

Lastly, Technical Committee Chair Pao stated that the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is being worked on to memorialize this arrangement with various agencies.

LAND MOBILE RADIO (LMR) UPDATE

The purpose of this discussion item is to provide an update on the Land Mobile Radio (LMR) System:

- Permits issued to date is approximately 84% completed.
- Site Access Agreement (SAA) process approximately 98% completed.
- Started construction on approximately 78% of sites.
- Equipment ordered is approximately 98% completed.
- Zero recordable injuries to date.

There is one (1) outstanding SAA remaining which is on Catalina Island for Site DPK.

Phase 4 work such as site optimization and microwave alignment is currently underway.

Narrow-banding is underway for Channel 16. Technical Lead Engineer, Ted Pao, is leading the coordination between the project team and the LA County Sheriff's Dept.

Site construction at US Forest Service (USFS) sites were severely impacted by fires in the months of September, October and November 2020. Not only was the contractor forced to vacate active construction projects, it also delayed the start of Sites ESR, MTL2, and BUR1.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING FOR USE OF LA-RICS USER EQUIPMENT

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (the "MOU") is made and entered into this _____ day of _____, 2018,

BY AND BETWEEN	THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT, hereinafter referred to as "LASD";
AND	
	THE LOS ANGELES COUNTY FIRE DEPARTMENT , hereinafter referred to as "LACoFD"
AND	
	THE LOS ANGELES REGIONAL INTEROPERABLE COMMUNICATIONS SYSTEM AUTHORITY ("LA-RICS"), a Joint Powers Authority, hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Authority".

WHEREAS, the Authority entered into Agreement No. LA-RICS 007 on August 15, 2013, with Motorola Solutions, Inc. (Motorola) for the design, construction, and implementation of a Land Mobile Radio (LMR) System including thirteen (13) Analog Conventional Voice Radio System Channels (ACVRS).;

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for the use and management of the thirteen (13) ACVRS channels identified in Exhibit A attached to this MOU;

WHEREAS, LASD and LACoFD are agreeable to accept, manage and use the 13 ACVRS channels once Final System Acceptance has been achieved.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and conditions set forth herein, the parties hereto and each of them do agree as follows:

Page 1 AGENDA ITEM F - ATTACHMENT

1. PURPOSE

The purpose of this MOU is to allow the Authority to transfer management of the thirteen (13) LA-RICS ACVRS LMR Channels to LASD and LACoFD and for LASD and LACoFD to manage and use the channels in a proper manner and allow access to these channels for all LA-RICS members in good standing.

2. CHANNELS FOR LA-RICS MEMBER USE

LASD and LACoFD acknowledges the management and use of the thirteen (13) ACVRS channels. If at any time following the execution of this MOU, the Authority requires the return of some or all of the channels, or LASD and or LACoFD elects to relinquish management of some or all of the channels, LASD and or LACoFD shall relinquish each agencies' respective channels set forth in Exhibit A (ACVRS Channel Names and Frequencies Matrix) to this MOU in accordance with Section 8, Relinquishing of Channels, of this MOU.

3. CONDITIONS OF USE

LASD and LACoFD shall:

- 3.1 Enter each agencies respective ACVRS channels into their Zetron Console Dispatch System.
- 3.2 Report any misuse of channels.
- 3.3 Maintain a channel assignment log to track channel usage, i.e. assigned agency, duration of use, time of use etc.
- 3.4 LASD and LACoFD acknowledge and understand that the thirteen (13) ACVRS channels will not be encrypted and that users will be operating "in the clear."
- 3.5 In the event that any LA-RICS member agency requests use of the Authority's ACVRS channels, except as otherwise provided herein, that agency will be provided twenty-four (24) hour a day access to ACVRS channels. LA-RICS member Law Enforcement Agencies shall contact the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department's Sheriff's Communication Center (SCC) located at 1277 N. Eastern Avenue, Los Angeles CA 90063 (323) 881-8100 for channel reservations and assignments. LA-RICS member Fire Agencies shall contact the Los Angeles County Fire Department's Command and Control Center (FCCF) located at 1320 North Eastern Avenue Los Angeles, CA 90040 (323) 881-6183 for channel reservations and assignments.

Since twelve (12) of the thirteen (13) ACVRS channels are regional and not "countywide," channels will be provided in an area of the county where they

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are supportive of the operation in question. The single countywide ACVRS channel shall be restricted for use by the LACoFD. This channel may be requested by any LA-RICS member agency, however; access to it will be determined solely by the LACoFD.

Although six (6) channels are assigned to LASD and seven (7) channels are assigned to LACoFD, all 13 channels will potentially be made available to all members. For example, if a fire agency calls FCCF requesting an ACVRS channel and FCCF determines that there are no available fire channels, then FCCF will contact SCC and request the use of an ACVRS law channel. SCC shall evaluate the request and assign an appropriate channel for use. The same protocol holds true in the opposite situation.

Some or all of the thirteen (13) ACVRS channels may occasionally be taken down for maintenance by LA-RICS at any time. In the event any of the channels must be taken down, the Authority will notify either SCC of FCCF of such shut down as soon as possible. The Authority will also notify SCC or FCCF of the approximate time that the channel(s) will become available.

- 3.6 LASD and LACoFD enter into this MOU with the understanding and acknowledgement that (except for the singular countywide channel) the Authority's ACVRS channels have regional coverage that may or may not be supportive of their operation(s). LASD and LACoFD agree that it will inform all of its ACVRS channel users of this limitation and will work with member agencies accordingly to provide channels that best meet operational requirements.
- 3.7 LASD and LACoFD enter into this MOU with the understanding and acknowledgement that the emergency trigger on members' radio(s) used while operating in the ACVRS coverage area may be programmed to function on the members' home radio system. LASD and LACoFD understand and agree that in the event that users operating on ACVRS channels need to call for emergency assistance, their emergency trigger may not work and they will be required to have a plan to call for assistance in the event of an emergency. LASD and LACoFD acknowledge that they understand that dispatchers may not be monitoring any of the ACVRS channels. LASD and LACoFD should notify member agencies regarding this life safety issue. Member agencies using the ACVRS are required to have a plan in the event that a member needs to call for emergency assistance. Member agencies are required to notify their users of the plan and to ensure that their members know how to call for assistance if necessary.
- 3.8 LASD and LACoFD enter into this MOU with the understanding and acknowledgement that radio conversations conducted on ACVRS channels will be recorded by LA-RICS and or LASD and LACoFD. SCC and FCCF should notify members using the ACVRS of this detail.

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3.9 SCC and FCCF shall only assign ACVRS channels to members who are in good standing with the requirements and obligations of its membership in the Authority as set forth in the Authority's Joint Powers Agreement and any adopted Funding Plan(s), and shall not be in default thereto.

4. TERM OF MOU

- 4.1 The MOU shall commence upon execution by both parties and shall remain in effect until terminated by either party as provided herein, and as stipulated by Section 6.01, Withdrawal of Members, of the LA-RICS JPA.
- 4.2 Notwithstanding the foregoing, either party shall have the option of terminating this MOU at any time for any reason upon giving the cancelled party notice in writing at least ninety (90) calendar days advance notice of such termination. All channels set forth in Exhibit A (Channel Assignment Matrix) must be returned prior to conclusion of the 90 calendar day notice.

5. CONSIDERATION

This MOU is granted on a gratis basis in furtherance of public safety goals. Consideration for this MOU is parties' full and faithful compliance with the mutual promises, covenants, terms and conditions set forth herein.

- 7.2 Notice will be sufficiently given for all purposes as follows:
 - a) <u>Personal delivery</u>. When personally delivered to the recipient, notice is effective on delivery.
 - b) <u>First Class mail</u>. When mailed first class to the last known address of the recipient, notice is effective three mail delivery days after deposit in a United States Postal Service office or mailbox.

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- c) <u>Certified mail</u>. When mailed certified, return receipt requested, notice is effective on receipt, if delivery is confirmed by a return receipt.
- d) <u>Overnight delivery</u>. When delivered by an overnight delivery service, charges prepaid or charged to the sender's account, notice is effective on delivery, if delivery is confirmed by the delivery service.
- e) <u>Facsimile transmission</u>. When sent by fax to the last known fax number of the recipient, notice is effective on receipt. Any notice given by fax will be deemed received on the next business day if it is received after 5:00 p.m. or on a non-business day.
- f) <u>Email</u>. When sent by email, notice is effective on receipt. Any notice given by email will be deemed received on the next business day if it is received after 5:00 p.m. or on a non-business day.
- 7.3 Any correctly addressed notice that is refused, unclaimed, or undeliverable because of an act or omission of the party to be notified, will be deemed effective as of the first date the notice was refused, unclaimed or deemed undeliverable by the postal authorities, messenger or overnight delivery service.
- 7.4 Addresses and persons to be notified may be changed by either party by giving ten (10) calendar days prior written notice thereof to the other party.

8. RELINQUISHING OF CHANNELS

In accordance with conditions of this MOU, the LASD and LACoFD shall relinquish all channels set forth in Exhibit A (ACVRS Channel Matrix) to the Authority.

9. INDEMNITY

LASD and LACoFD shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the Authority, it's elected and appointed officers, member agencies, employees, contractors and agents from and against any and all liability, including but not limited to demands, claims, actions, fees, costs, and expenses (including attorney and expert witness fees), arising from or connected with the LASD and LACoFD acts and/or omissions arising from and/or relating to this MOU, except for such loss or damage arising from the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the Authority.

10. INDEPENDENT STATUS

This MOU is by and between LASD, LACoFD and Authority and is not intended and shall not be construed to create the relationship of agent, servant, employee, partnership, joint venture or association as between LASD, LACoFD and Authority.

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11. ASSIGNMENT

This MOU is personal to Authority, LASD and LACoFD, and, in the event the LASD and or LACoFD shall attempt to assign or transfer the same in whole or in part, all rights hereunder shall immediately terminate.

12. DEFAULT

Parties agree that if default shall be made in any of the terms or conditions herein contained, the non-defaulting party may forthwith revoke and terminate this MOU.

13. WAIVER

- 13.1 Any waiver by either party of the breach of any one or more of the covenants, conditions, terms and MOUs herein contained shall not be construed to be a waiver of any other breach of the same or of any other covenant, condition, term or MOU herein contained, nor shall failure on the part of either party to require exact, full and complete compliance with any of the covenants, conditions, terms or MOUs herein contained be construed as in any manner changing the terms of this MOU or stopping either party from enforcing the full provisions thereof.
- 13.2 No option, right, power, remedy, or privilege of either party shall be construed as being exhausted by the exercise thereof in one or more instances. The rights, powers, options, and remedies given either party by this MOU shall be cumulative.

14. INTERPRETATION

Unless the context of this MOU clearly requires otherwise: (i) the plural and singular numbers shall be deemed to include the other; (ii) the masculine, feminine and neuter genders shall be deemed to include the others; (iii) "or" is not exclusive; and (iv) "includes" and "including" are not limiting.

15. GOVERNING LAW, JURISDICTION, AND VENUE

This MOU shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of California. The parties agree and consent to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of the State of California for all purposes regarding this MOU and further agree and consent that venue of any action brought hereunder shall be exclusively in the County of Los Angeles.

16. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this MOU is held invalid, the remainder of this MOU shall not be affected thereby if such remainder would then continue to conform to the terms and requirements of applicable law.

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17. AMENDMENTS

All changes, modifications, or amendments to this MOU must be in the form of a written Amendment duly executed by authorized representatives of the Authority, LASD and LACoFD.

18. ENTIRE MOU

This MOU, and Exhibit A and any executed Amendments, between the parties hereto, and no addition or modification of any terms or provisions shall be effective unless set forth in writing, signed by LASD, LACoFD and Authority.
